DkIT has an array of accommodation options for international students within walking distance to campus, and accommodation in Dundalk is 50% cheaper than in Dublin.







Supports On Campus

Healthcare

DkIT has a Health Unit on campus, that is free-of-charge to any registered student of the Institute.

If you have a condition for which you need ongoing medical care, you will need to register with a Doctor's Surgery in Dundalk. The Institute requires you to tell us at application stage the details of any medical conditions that you have, in order that we can plan for your care needs.

You must have health insurance for your entire stay in Ireland. Immigration officers may ask you for proof of this when you arrive.

Non-EU students must obtain private health insurance. You can purchase insurance in your home country, however you will need to ensure that it is valid in Ireland and in any other countries you plan to travel to. There are different levels of private health insurance available. Students are advised to read their policy documents carefully. Immigration Service Delivery (ISD) requires that, if you have health insurance from your own country it must cover you up to €25,000 for in-hospital treatment.

If you are coming to Ireland to study on an academic course of more than one year, you are deemed 'ordinary resident' from the moment you arrive in Ireland, and therefore require more comprehensive health insurance.

Further details on health insurance plans available to students are available via the Study and Protect website

Comprehensive plans are also available from one of the three main private health insurance companies in Ireland: VHI, Irish Life or Laya Healthcare. Please note that in order to apply for a policy from one of these companies you will need to provide an address in Ireland and you may also require a PPS number. We recommend that you check the waiting periods on these policies. Further information on health insurance in Ireland is available through the Health Insurance Authority website.

Counselling

DkIT operates a free and confidential counselling service to students. Counsellors provide encouragement and support on academic issues, coping with stress and other issues affecting student life. Email: counsellor@dkit.ie

Faulkner Hall (MPC)


The Faulkner Hall is a multi-purpose centre used for indoor activities. It is used for both class activities and also for many of the sports clubs and societies within DkIT.

Outdoor Playing Fields

The multi-functional playing fields cater for all the main sports, Gaelic Football, Hurling, Soccer, Rugby and Athletics.

Jogging lane

The jogging facility is widely used by both staff and students alike and runs along the perimeter of the playing fields and is approximately 1 mile in distance.



Accommodation

Accommodation in the Dundalk area is approximately 50% cheaper than the Dublin region.

Accommodation-types available for international students at DkIT include:

- Hall-of-residence accommodation (Rental costs vary, depending on the hall-of-residence and room-type. Halls-of-residences will give priority to students, seeking to reside for an academic year (2 semesters).
- Private house rental (indicative cost: €100 per week. Excludes utilities). For suggested private accommodation rental options, check www.daft.ie/lettings/ or www.myhome.ie/rentals
- You are advised to exercise caution in paying a deposit on accommodation you have not yet seen. It is advisable that the rented house you select has a functioning security alarm and is fitted with smoke-and carbon-monoxide detectors.
- Family homestays (indicative cost: €180 - €200 per week. Includes all meals, utilities and facilities)

DkIT International Office has an Accommodations Officer to support you with your accommodation-search, depending on your accommodation preference. Most international students elect to stay in halls-of-residence in their first year of study, in order to meet new students and be located within walking-distance of college.

Please note that DkIT does not own, or manage halls-of-residence. Your rental agreement with your accommodation-provider is legally-binding. It is important that you make yourself aware of the terms and conditions when signing a rental agreement.

We advise that you select your accommodation, prior to arriving in Dundalk. Payment should be made in full for the accommodation (including Deposit and Utilities, where utilities are charged in advance).

21st Century Graduates

DkIT graduates are in high demand by both employers and institutes of higher education across Ireland and beyond.

Our emphasis on hands-on learning through work-placements, student projects, practical assessment, and our close links with industry means that DkIT graduates are job ready when they complete their studies.

In 2016, global OECD recognised DkIT as a 'highly performing institution in respect of entrepreneurial behaviours and mindsets amongst staff and students.' All academic courses have embedded elements of entrepreneurship within them with the aim of producing desirable graduate attributes such as creativity, critical thinking problem solving and teamwork.

The Institute's annual conferring of Awards takes place at the beginning of November. Conferring ceremonies are joyful occasions in the life of the Institute, when the community at DkIT comes together to honour its new graduates, and their family and friends.

About last year's graduates

- 94% employed or in further study within 9 months of graduation
- 82% earned greater than 20k at entry level positions
- 73% have permanent contract within 9 months of graduation
- 71% of graduates said that their qualification helped them secure their current position
- 75% said that their area of study was relevant to their careers now

Fees & Visas



*Health insurance is a requirement for all international students registered at the Institute. A copy of your health insurance policy can be provided to you on request. Please note that your policy provides cover for new illnesses, or accidents arising in Ireland during the period of cover. It does not provide for pre-existing conditions requiring ongoing treatment, for which you will need to register with a local Doctor in Ireland. Please check with DkIT International Office for further details on your cover.

Visas

Citizens from some countries require a study-visa for Ireland. All visa queries should be directed to your Education Agent, or to the Irish Embassy in your home-country. A list of the Irish Embassies can be found at www.dfa.ie/embassies/irish-embassies-abroad/

For up-to-date information on visa-regulations, please check www.inis.gov.ie

Ireland is **not** a member of the Schengen Agreement. If you have obtained a visa for a Schengen country, you will need to apply for a separate visa for Ireland.

Dundalk Institute of Technology supports new international students on arrival with application for the **Irish Residence Permit** (formerly known as GNIB Card).

On arrival in Dublin you will receive a landing stamp on your passport, permitting you to stay in Ireland for (typically) 90 days.

You are required to make an appointment with the Immigration authority, **before** the date on your landing stamp expires, in order to extend your study-visa, and apply for an Irish Residence Permit (IRP).



Supporting Your Arrival

1. Airport-Collection

DkIT International Office will arrange an airport collection service if your accommodation has been arranged by DkIT International Office.

2. Money and Cost-of-Living

Once your accommodation and deposit have been paid in advance, you are advised not to carry large amounts of cash with you on your arrival to Ireland. A guide amount of €500 should be sufficient. Bring your ATM and Credit Card. Check that your ATM Card can be used in Ireland to withdraw money. This will limit risks of carrying cash, but will incur charges for withdrawals, or purchases.

Additional money (minimum €3,000) can be sent by TT, after you have opened an Irish bank account.

DkIT International Office will assist you with basic shopping on arrival in Dundalk, e.g purchase of a phone-card SIM, so that you have an Irish contact mobile number. The monthly phone-cost is typically €20 (includes unlimited data).

Monthly spending costs*:

- Accommodation: €550/month
- Food, Hobbies, Travel and Entertainment: €300/month.

**These are guide-rates only and will vary according to your personal budget and expectations.*

Some international students choose to find part-time jobs while studying at DkIT. The minimum hourly wage is currently €10.10. If you secure a part-time job, you will be required to apply for a PPS Number (Personal Public Service Number). Enquire at DkIT International Office for further details on getting a PPS number.

Your study-visa allows you to work up to 20 hours per week during the academic term, and up to 40 hours per week in the holidays. Your programme of study at DkIT is full-time and the demands of study need to be balanced with your free-time. You are required to attend at a minimum of 80% - 85% of your classes each semester, for the purposes of Irish Residence Permit (IRP) renewal. For that reason, we advise you to keep part-time working to a minimum.

You will need to open a Bank Account after your arrival in Dundalk, as a condition of your study-visa. DkIT International Office will assist you with bank-account opening. Bank account is opened in EURO. Once you have opened a bank-account, you will be issued with a bank statement (as verification of your Irish postal address) and a bank-card with a PIN number. You can then arrange a TT transfer from your home country.

3. International Welcome Days

DkIT International Office coordinates International Welcome Days. It is very important that you attend at International Welcome Days. The purpose of International Welcome Days is to:

- Welcome you to DkIT and introduce you to the Campus
- Meet new International Students
- Meet Academic- and Student-Services Staff
- Get registered
- Learn more about Ireland and some of the Cultural Differences you can expect to find
- Learn about important facilities and supports available to you
- Socialise with other new international students

4. Irish Residence Permit

DkIT International Office will assist you with your application for an Irish Residence Permit (IRP) – formerly known as GNIB card. As a new student you will be accompanied by DkIT International Office to the local Immigration Office – by appointment – to complete this process. The IRP process may take a few weeks to complete, as you will need to have opened a bank-account first. You will need the following documents to apply for the IRP card:

- Your passport
- A Letter from Dundalk Institute of Technology, verifying that you are a registered student of the Institute and that

you have paid your tuition fees and charges in full for the current academic year.

- Class-attendance record (for continuing students at the Institute). For IRP renewal-application, you are required to have a minimum of 85% class-attendance from the previous academic year. Poor class-attendance may result in your IRP application being rejected, or being issued on a temporary basis only.
- €300 IRP registration fee payable by credit/ debit card.
- Proof of your address in Ireland (utility bill, or equivalent).
- Evidence that you can support yourself financially while studying in Ireland (€3,000 in your bank-account if you are staying for 6+ months), or equivalent of €500 per month, if you are staying for 6 months, or less.

If you are residing in the Dublin area, you can apply for the Irish Residence Permit to the INIS Office, 13/14, Burgh Quay, Dublin 2. You must book an appointment first online.

Immigration Arrangements for Third-level Graduate Programme

If you graduate with an award at Level 8 on the National Framework of Qualifications, you will be granted a **one-year** (twelve month) permission to remain in Ireland to seek employment (up to a maximum of seven years student permission overall), i.e time spent on Stamp 2 as a student and on Stamp 1G under this programme cannot exceed an aggregate time of seven years in total.

If you graduate with an award at Level 9, or 10 on the National Framework of Qualifications you will be granted a **two-year** (twenty-four months) permission to remain in Ireland to seek employment (up to a maximum of eight years student permission overall), i.e time spent on Stamp 2 as a student and on Stamp 1G under this programme cannot exceed an aggregate time of eight years in total.

Class-Start

Typical class contact hours weekly is approximately 20 hours, depending on the programme of study. The programme typically consists of lectures, tutorials and/or lab practicals. It is your responsibility to maintain regular class-attendance.

In the event of unforeseen circumstances that may necessitate you being absent from your programme temporarily, or needing to apply to defer your exams due to absence, it is important that you communicate with your Head of Department on this matter.

Examinations

Semester examinations typically consist of scheduled examinations and continuous assessment. Continuous assessment may account for up to 50% of a module-weighting, so regular class-attendance is very important. Continuous assessments may be oral, written, presentation based, group projects or lab practicals.


Scheduled Semester 1




